

Wanna Be Counselors Skit

Camper: “ _____ ” (Name of counselor),
“ _____,” (Name of counselor)!

Counselor: “Yes, what do you want?”

Campers: “We wanna be counselors. We wanna be counselors. What do we have to do to be counselors?”

(Be very bouncy and enthusiastic!)

Counselor: “Well, okay, so you want to be counselors . . . “ Say this hesitantly.

Camper: Ya, ya, we wanna’ be counselors. We wanna’ be counselors. What do we have to do to be counselors?

Counselor: “Well, you first have to answer some really hard questions to be counselors.”

Camper: “Okay, okay, what are the questions? What are the questions?” (Say this with great enthusiasm.)

Counselor: Ask this question to one of the kids. After this question ask each other kid a question until every camper has had a turn.

“Okay, here we go . . . how many days of the week begin with the letter ‘T?’”

Camper: Well, let’s see . . . There’s Tuesday, Thursday . . . and there’s Today and Tomorrow!! That’s four!!

Counselor: Well, that’s certainly a different answer, but I guess that IS correct.”

Counselor: “Here’s the next question... How many seconds are there in a year?”

Camper: Hm . . . that’s a really tough one. Let me think.” Count on fingers. Fumble around . . . mumble . . . count on fingers more.

“I have it . . .”

Counselor: “Okay, so how many seconds are there in a year?”

Camper: “Twelve!!!”

Counselor: “Twelve? How did you arrive at that number?”

Camper: “It’s easy.” Start counting on fingers. “There’s January second, February second, march second set. Twelve!”

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Counselor: “ARRRRRGH! Well, once again one of you has a very creative answer, and we certainly need creativity in our counselors.”

Counselor: “Next question . . . How can a man go eight days without sleep?”

Camper: “No problem, he sleeps at night!”

Counselor: Look at the audience with a ‘I don’t believe it’ look on your face . . . “I’ll have to give that one to you too!”

Counselor: “How can you drop a raw egg onto a concrete floor without cracking it?”

Camper: “Hm . . . let’s see . . . Oh ya! Concrete floors are very hard to crack!”

Counselor: “Grrrrrrrrrrrrrrrr!”

Counselor: “Oh this just isn’t right . . .”

Camper: “Four!” (Touch each one as you count from 1 - 4.)

Counselor: (Act like you are starting to cry out of frustration!)

(Continue as above only asking enough questions until each camper has answered a question. You can pick and choose to use the questions you want.)

Questions and answers:

1. A math question, how much dirt is there in a hole 3 feet deep, 6 feet long and 4 feet wide? ans. None, or it wouldn’t be a hole!
2. Another math question, if it took 8 men ten hours to build a wall, how long would it take four men to build it? ans. No time at all. It’s already built!
3. One more math question, if there are 6 apples and you take away 4, how many do you have? ans. The 4 you took!
4. If you had only one match and entered a dark room containing an oil lamp, some newspaper, and some kindling wood, which would you light first? ans. The match!
5. Some months have 31 days, others have 30 days. How many have 28 days? and. All months have 28 days!
6. What can you never eat for breakfast? ans. Dinner!

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7. You have a cup placed on a table. You are pointing towards the North, and the cup is facing towards the South. On which side is the cup's handle? ans. It's handle will always be on the outside!

Counselor: "AAAAAAAAAAAAUUUUUUUUUUUGGGGGGGGGGHHHHHHHHH"

This is the last question for all of you to answer together: How many 'D's are there in the song, 'Rudolf, the Red Nosed Reindeer?'"

Campers: (Get in a circle like talking it over. Don't take very long! Then say, "743!")

Counselor: "743! You're kidding! How did you get that number?"

Campers: (All together! Sing this to the tune of 'Rudolf, the Red Nosed Reindeer.)""De, de, de, de, de, de. De de de de de de de. etc."

The counselors scream and yell and chase the kids off of the stage.
